

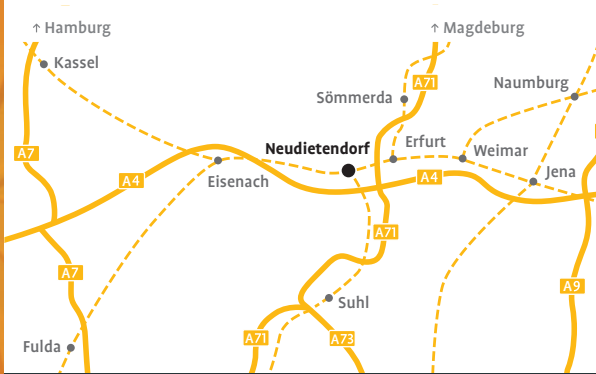


THE LOCATION

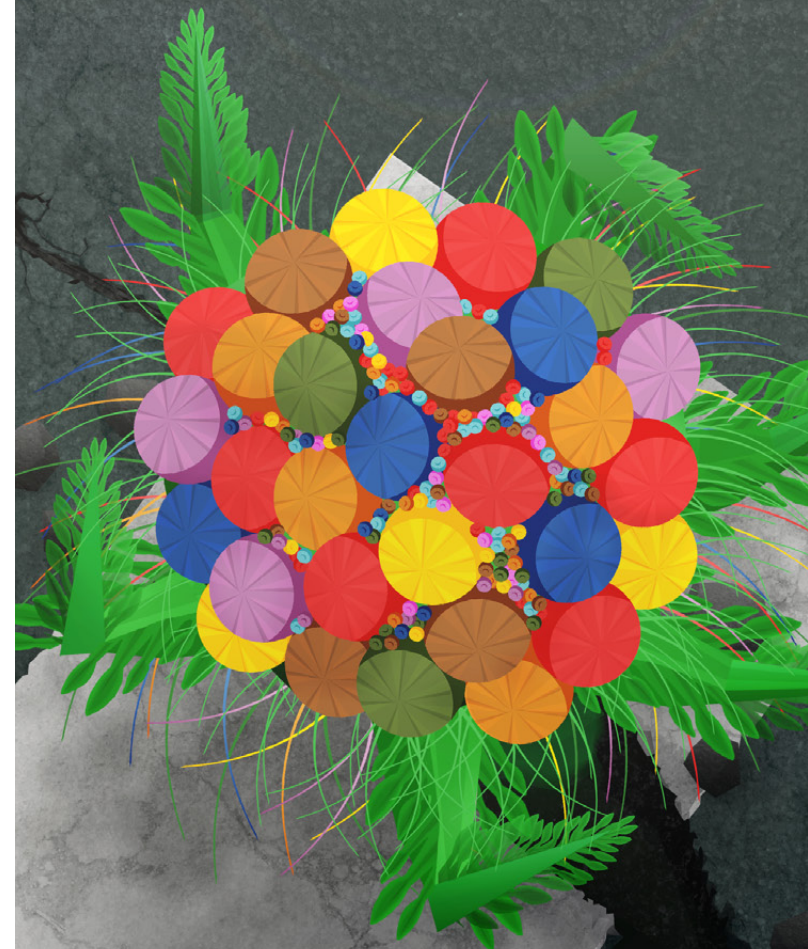
